From Pastor Pat



For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven. - Ec-clesiastes 3:1

On August 1, I completed 34 years of ministry at Good Shepherd and in June, I turned 66. As you might expect, because of these milestones, I have been prayerfully discerning when would be the right time to retire.

I am writing to share the news with you that after prayerful discernment over the last few months, I plan to retire from my call as Associate Pastor at Good Shepherd, effective December 1, 2023. It has been my great joy and honor to serve as one of your Pastors for over 34 years.

My heart is filled with joy and gratitude for the family of Good Shepherd because you have been a part of so much of my life. When I began my call Charissa was just five years old. Good Shepherd has always been welcoming to Steve and me, so much so, that Cincinnati became our home.

As much as you have been a part of the life of my family, I have been a part of the life of many of your families. This has been one of the unexpected privileges of being a Pastor at Good Shepherd. As a caring Christian community, we have shared much: faith, love, joy, laughter, tears, ministry, service, and struggles. You have been a blessing from God, and this has empowered me to be a blessing to others. I cannot thank you enough for all the ways you have embodied the love of Christ in our time together.

Over the years of ministry, you have accepted me as your Pastor as I served in various ministry roles in the congregation. I have been fortunate with these changing roles. They allowed me to develop new ministry skills as they challenged me to consider the way GSLC might best fulfill God's mission in these areas.

One of my greatest joys as a Pastor at Good Shepherd is to have served on such a vibrant staff. I was guided by the excellent leadership of four senior pastors who envisioned how Good Shepherd might embody God's mission in our context. I served alongside four associate pastors who had unique gifts for ministry that enriched the life of Good Shepherd.

I also served with various Directors of Faith Formation and Directors of Music who always brought a new depth to growing faith and providing inspiring worship each week. There were also many other staff members who gladly participated in God's mission at Good Shepherd whose work I appreciated very much. In my opinion this synergy from such a staff helped the congregation move forward as it generously shared God's grace in the world.

Please know that Pastor Lorne will be sharing important information with the congregation in the upcoming weeks about this transition. I look forward to the next few months so I can help ensure a smooth transition of ministry and have time to say goodbye to all the beloved people of Good Shepherd.

Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. As for the things that you have learned and received and heard and noticed, do them, and the God of peace will be with you. - Philippians 4:8-9

I know I will miss being a Pastor at Good Shepherd for many reasons, but I am confident that Pastor Lorne, Pastor Alex, the GSLC Staff and Church Council will continue to work towards God's mission for Good Shepherd.

Joy Loewen. Woman to Woman: Sharing Jesus with a Muslim Friend. The author has spent 30 years in outreach to Muslim women. At first, she did her best to avoid them but then learned that many of these women are irresistibly attracted to the love of Jesus! Sharing powerful stories from her own experience, she shows how to develop authentic connections that can change lives forever.

Christine Mallouhi. Miniskirts, Mothers & Muslims. Mallouhi is the Western, Christian wife of an Arab from a conservative Muslim family. Her observant, witty book reveals the conventions that govern Muslim society and charts the unwitting mistakes Westerners can make when meeting Muslims.
