**Second, I am grateful for the Call Committee**, who worked diligently to identify potential candidates to interview. I know they were thorough in their interview process, and this helped identify Pastor Lorne as the top candidate.

**Third, I am grateful for the Church Council**, who made it a priority to interview Pastor Lorne during the Christmas season, which then allowed for the Congregational Meeting to take place on January 15.

Fourth, I am grateful for all the members of GSLC, who turned out for the Meet and Greet with Pastor Lorne and who came to the Congregational Meeting to vote on calling him. Thanks Good Shepherd for being committed to the call process.

**Fifth, I am grateful for the staff of Good Shepherd,** who worked very hard during the transition to maintain the mission and ministry of GSLC, and even try some new things. I know it was daunting at times because some unforeseen things happened. However, the commitment the staff has to the mission of GSLC is amazing. Their leadership is a blessing to Good Shepherd, and they are always exploring ways to help us live out our mission: to share God's grace, grow our faith and serve others!

Finally, I am grateful to God, for being our Good Shepherd, who is always with us (Psalm 23:4).

# **Music Ministry**

Miserere Mei Deus, Gregorio Allegri: There is perhaps no psalm more central to our Lenten journey than Psalm 51, where the psalmist implores God for mercy for the sins he has committed and asks to be cleansed and restored in the goodness of God. This psalm was our congregational psalm for Ash Wednesday, where we featured three different settings during worship, including one of the most famous from Gregorio Allegri's "Miserere Mei Deus" which was sung by the Chancel Choir.

# In addition to being particularly beautiful, this piece has a unique place in music history.

Gregorio Allegri was a priest and composer who sang in the Sistine Chapel Choir from 1629 until his death in 1652. Credited with many accomplishments (including writing the first string quartet), his best known work is his setting of Psalm 51, written for two choirs. It has been sung for many years during Holy Week celebrations in the Vatican and it is held up as a primary example of Renaissance era choral music (even though it was technically composed during the Baroque period...music historians generally regard the year 1600 as being the dividing line between Renaissance and Baroque).

The work acquired a considerable reputation for mystery and inaccessibility between the time of its composition and the era of modern recording as the Vatican forbade copies and publication to preserve it's aura of mystery (going so far as to threaten any attempt at publication with excommunication). The Catholic Church however were not prepared for a 14-year-old Wolfgang

Amadeus Motzart, who, upon hearing the work twice, transcribed it faithfully from memory in 1770 creating the first known unauthorized copy.

As you connect with prayer, fasting, and almsgiving this Lent, I encourage you to use this piece of music in the background of your faith practices to help better connect you to the Word of God (available on our YouTube page at <a href="https://">https://</a> youtu.be/x3gCshbi2Fk).

You may remember Andrew from the times he performed at 11 AM worship last summer. All are invited to hear Kevin and Andrew present a program of music written for trumpet and organ, featuring works by Albinoni, Hovannes, Neruda, and Sibelius, including an organ improvisation by Dr. Seal.

April 23rd, 3:00 PM: Mendelssohn's Psalm 42 and Good Shepherd member Doug McConnell's Songs of Celebration featuring the combined choirs of Good Shepherd and a professional orchestra. Our end of the year concert will feature the combined choirs of Good Shepherd and a professional orchestra, conducted by Dr. Kevin Seal, performing one of Mendelssohn's most beloved choral/ orchestral works, his setting of Psalm 42. The first half of the program will consist of a work by Good Shepherd member and composer Doug McConnell, Songs of Celebration. Doug has been busily re-orchestrating this three movement cycle, first written for a church in Connecticut, and we are thrilled to share the world premiere performance of his re-write!
