Congregational Meeting Announcement

Over the weekend of December 31-January 1, it was announced at worship that the Senior Pastor Call Team has unanimously recommended to the Church Council that Good Shepherd call a Senior Pastor candidate. Church Council met with the candidate on December 29th and voted unanimously to recommend to the congregation that we call this candidate as our next Senior Pastor.

We ask all members to keep their eyes on their mail. A letter will be mailed out January 3rd to all members with the next step in the process. You'll have an opportunity to listen to the candidate's past sermons online, meet with the candidate, and learn more about the candidate.

Additionally, a Congregational Meeting has been scheduled to vote on the candidate on January 15, 2023 at 10 am. Plan to attend this meeting as Good Shepherd is required to have a quorum present to vote on the candidate.

Pastor's Thoughts



What happens with visitors show up for worship on Christmas Day after worship has ended?



What a lovely Christmas Eve and Christmas Day!

No one would be surprised to know that I love the energy on Christmas Eve. The candles, the songs, the people, the traditions: it's beautiful!

However, I have always enjoyed Christmas Day services the most. It's a little less exciting and dramatic but I truly treasure that service. On a day that can feel so hustle and bustle with family, presents, meals, and travel, to start the morning with a reminder that this day is about God dwelling among us, is a centering practice that I truly appreciate more with each passing year.

This year, particularly, carried some additional meaning.

It seems the Holy Spirit thought I needed a much more tangible intervention to remind me about the reason for the season. After the Sunday morning Christmas service concluded and all the folks had left, my family was waiting at the front doors as I prepared to lock up the building. We had plans to head home and to unwrap gifts and have some lunch togeth-

Just then, a van pulled up and its occupants looked puzzled as I began to lock the exterior door. The passenger door slid open to reveal a large family dressed in their Sunday best asking, "Are we late? Or has service not started vet?"

I had never seen this family before and was particularly surprised by how many folks were in the van. It was actually two families! I said "Oh! Well, we are locking up. We had service at 11am..." The couples exchanged disappointing looks because it was now 12:20pm.

One of the passengers asked very politely, "Is there any way we could **come in for a moment to pray?".** I'm not a person to turn someone away from coming to church and connecting with God, so I said, "Absolutely! You just have to let me get the lights on."

The families large entered the sanctuary with smiles for the chance to gather and worship on this Holy Morning. They kept repeating how grateful they were for my willingness to "let us in". I reminded them it wasn't "MY House" and that I was happy to stay a bit longer for them to honor the day.

What followed was 30-minutes of conversation, introductions, prayers, scripture readings, communion, and photos at the Christmas Tree!

I can safely say that this year was one of the best and more tangible experiences of the Christmas Story I had ever experienced. A couple of families, holy, traveling from far away, looking for a place to stay for a moment, and center themselves in God's promise. What a story for Christmas morning! Thanks be to God!

Video Production Room | Cry Room Conversion

Work begins the week of January 16th on conversion of the existing Cry Room to a Video Production room for worship & live streaming.

In 2023, Good Shepherd plans to convert GSLC's existing Cry Room to a Video Production Room. The room will house the Live Stream Computer, PowerPoint Computer, and a new soundboard for the Live Stream audio mixer. The move will significantly improve the audio quality of online worship, allow for real time communication between the operators, removes troubleshooting from view during worship, and improves line of sight & movement in the balcony. The Prayground helps make this move possible and staff are exploring options to stream worship into a room (Nursery or other) for parents to also take kids that would allow them to stay connected to worship.

Worship & Music in January

A heartfelt THANK YOU to all our volunteers who helped with worship during the Advent and Christmas seasons. Our beautiful worship would not have been able to happen without your talent and dedication. Thank you all so much!

Last month we hosted the first in what will likely become an annual event: A sing-along concert featuring Handel's Messiah. Over 170 were in attendance with at least 120 in the sing-along "choir". You can watch a video of the concert on YouTube at https://youtu.be/80dXLf7nMpI.

Upcoming Concert Series Events:

January 15th, 3:00 PM: Schubert's Winterreise with Paul Max Tipton, bass-baritone, and Dr. Kevin Seal, piano.

Franz Schubert was a late-Classical/early-Romantic era composer born in 1797. He spent much of his life in the shadow of Beethoven. He died at the age of 31 in late 1728, having given his first & only public performances of his works earlier that year. Thankfully, his other works were discovered by the likes of Mendelssohn, Brahms, and others. He is now viewed as one of the finest composers in the history of western music.

Schubert wrote over 1500 works ranging from symphonies to instrumental music. His art songs (German: lieder) are where he made his most significant mark. With more than 600 songs, Schubert expanded the genre and its potential more than any composer before him. Best known are his two Song Cycles: Die Schöne Müllerin (The

Fair Maid of the Mill) and Winterreise (Winter's Journey), both set to poems by Wilhelm Müller.

Winterreise, written in 1827, was written in two parts. It consists of a drama from the point of view of a wandering protagonist who has left town after his lover falls in love with another. He reflects on love lost and the meaning of life as he journeys through a village. The poetry expresses a wide variety of moods and emotions, and the interpretation of these moods challenge even the most skilled singer. Schubert's music is some of the most beautiful and expertly crafted ever written for piano and voice.

The 3pm, January 15th Winterreise concert,

provides a rare performance of the entire cycle, performed with our own Dr. Kevin Seal on piano, and NYC-based Paul Max Tipton, bass-baritone. Paul Max is a skilled and versatile singer who enjoys an active career in opera, oratorio, and chamber music, and has performed and recorded with choirs and orchestras throughout the United States, Europe, and Asia.

January 29th, 3:00 PM: The Modern Double Bass | Peter McCutcheon in recital.

GSLC member, Peter McCutcheon will perform a recital of modern unaccompanied double bass works next month. The performance will feature works by Hans Fryba, Luciano Berio, and others and showcase the unique qualities of the double bass. This concert is a rare opportunity to hear and put a spotlight on one of the lowest and largest orchestral instruments!
